**Revolutionary
Cavalry**

Used by many Revolutionary War Cavalry units. Wide flat toe, leather lined, turned down cuff, flat top, leather stacked heel and leather sole. Cuff can be different colors but will be up charged. Height of boot comes to bottom of knee. One piece top.

Cavalry Boot

Smooth leather, leather sole. Flat wide toe, stacked leather combination heel; 1 piece top. Proper height to just below knee.

**Dragoon
Ankle Boot**

Actually an ankle-height shoe. Was issued to all arms.

Cavalry Boot

The ankle boots were issued to dragoons and cavalry, used by some mounted units even through the Civil War. Popularized by having one eyelet lace and taller than Jefferson Boot. Leather sole and stacked leather heel. Offered in Confederate Russett and Union Black.

Boot

This boot was used by U.S. and foreign military for dress and undress wear as well as used by some civilians. Full knee protection. It is unique that it has a U shaped throat in the top rear. Characterized by flat toe, leather stacked keel and 1 piece tops.

**The Renaissance
Bucket Boot**

Circa 1500. Extra heavy boot with exaggerated bucket-top and rigid leg "jack boot". Tall heel and square toe. Top may be pulled up or folded down. Available with contrasting outer color leather with up charge.

**Cavalry
Knee Boot**

Available in 1 or 2 piece tops and Officer or Enlisted models.

Colors: B, R

Our boots are copied from originals furnished by our customers, specimens in our own collection or in some cases, from museums that have allowed us to get specifications from their displays. We have kept the specifications for what we manufacture, as true to originals as possible.

Our boots are generally made of mule hide except where the original was obviously made of a different, readily available leather.

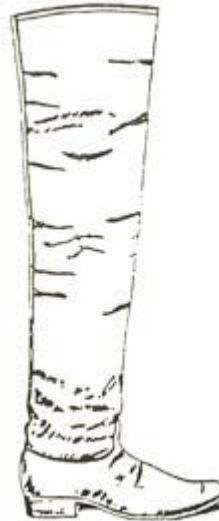

Cavalry Boot

This style boot was used by cavalry units in the War between the States, both by Union and Confederate alike. It is characterized by square toes, a seam in the back of the boot, and a scalloped knee guard. They were also used by Indian Wars Cavalry Troops through the 1880's. Horse or Mule hide is used per originals and are leather-lined for comfort. The heel is stacked leather and is an authentic reproduction.

Colors: B, R



This boot was popularized by many of the boy generals during the Civil War. A must for Cavalry riding in heavy brush or thickets. Leather sole, stacked leather heels.

Jack Boot

One piece top, leather sole and heel, round toe, leather lined flat top 13" - 15" tall. No hob nails or heel irons.

Side lace, 12 pair eyelets, full gussett, leather sole and heel about 12" tall, round toe smooth leather only.

Laced leather boots issued to cavalry and horse artillery regiments. Generally 13" - 15" tall. Laces and spurs not included.

Laced Cavalry Boot



3-strap boot for mounted men, generally 13" - 15" tall.

3-Strap Mounted Boot



This boot was modified by George S. Patton for himself and comes to just under the knee. It was made of black leather and he was photographed extensively wearing them during the N. African Campaign. Remember this boot is taller and comes to bottom of knee. Laces not included.

2 buckle style, rubber heel, rubber sole, 7 pair eyelet straps, 10-11" tall. Brown only - laces not provided. Used by all branches of service. Rough out is authentic.

A 'Non-Period' tall Roper-style boot. Rubber walking heel, Roper toe, lined, comes to just below the knee, side seams, leather sole. Can be worn over or under pants. Tell us which - usually not both.

**Contract Cavalry
Boot**

This 1872 Pattern Cavalry Contract Boot was issued to cavalry and mounted artillery. The tops were a bit fuller and slightly higher to accommodate the trouser leg inside boot top. It was used extensively through late 1880's. Height generally 14 inches.

**U.S. Trench
Boot**

This rough out dough boy trench boot was used by the American expeditionary forces in the European Theatre. 7 lace eyelets. Height approximately 4 1/2". It is almost identical to the 1876 Zulu shoe/boot used by the British Troops in Africa. It had smooth leather exposed.



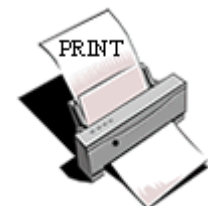

**Western
Gunfighter Boot**

The boots worn home by troops of the Civil War were often copied and mildly modified of those types that had served so well. This flat top boot is similar to the M-1862 with a taller heel. This boot can also be ordered with a separate color top with an up-charge.
